Narrator (POV)

- Three main types of narrators or points of view (POV):
 - first-person narrator
 - third-person limited
 - third-person omniscient

- First-person narrator is a character in the story who talks to us using *I*, the first-person pronoun
 - we know only what the narrator tells us, or chooses to tell us
 - we have to question whether this narrator is credible or unreliable; perhaps they don't (or can't) tell us the truth

- In the third-person omniscient POV, the narrator is not a character in the story, and can tell us everything about every character, including their thoughts and feelings
 - omniscient means "all-knowing"

- In the third-person limited POV, the narrator focuses on just one character but talks about the character in the third person, using he or she
 - we share one character's reactions to everything, but what we know about the other characters is limited
